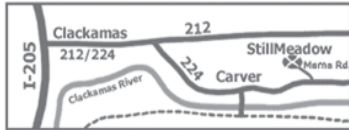
You are invited to participate in planning the Madrone Wall site

Clackamas County Parks is working with the community to complete a feasibility study and develop a concept plan to determine future uses and improvements to the former Hardscrabble Quarry. Also known as the Madrone Wall, the 43-acre site is located on Highway 224, just east of Carver. Purchased by Clackamas County in 1937, the site was once mined for road repair purposes, previously logged for timber, and also has been used by recreational rock climbers. It is currently not open to the public.

Citizens are encouraged to participate in the process by attending planning meetings or by submitting comments via mail, e-mail or telephone. Submitted comments will be presented during public meetings.
